CAMRA National Beer Scoring Guidelines

- 0 Undrinkable. No cask ale available or so poor you have to take it back or can't finish it.
- 1 Poor. Beer that is anything from barely drinkable to drinkable with considerable resentment.
- 2 Average, Competently kept, drinkable pint but doesn't inspire, not worth moving to another pub but you drink the beer without really noticing.
- 3 Good. Good beer in good form. You may cancel plans to move to next pub. You want to stay for another pint and may seek out the beer again.
- 4 Very Good. Excellent beer in excellent condition.
- 5 Perfect. Probably the best you are ever likely to find. A seasoned drinker will award this score very rarely.
